Planning and Development

Building and Development Permits:

Are you looking to build on or renovate your property? Development and/or building permits are required for most construction projects in WHRM. If you are renovating an existing building, constructing a new building, or putting up a storage shed, you need to obtain a permit before starting the job - even when under 100 sq. ft.

Permits are also needed for small projects such as signs, awnings, decks, porches, swimming pools, fences, and garden sheds and for repairs, alterations, additions, or demolition of existing buildings.

Please note that the issuance of a permit can take between 4-6 weeks from the time all required application material has been received by staff.

Solid Waste Bylaw Updates

Updates to the West Hants Regional Municipality Solid Waste Bylaw aim to reduce the amount of waste being sent to the landfill that's generated in West Hants. These changes promote recycling and composting, minimizing environmental impact, and foster a culture of responsibility and sustainability within the community.

The following are curbside collection Solid Waste Bylaws for all of WHRM (based on per unit):

- Maximum of five (5) residual waste regulation bags
- Residual waste must be placed in watertight clear, transparent bags with an overall length of not more than 3.28 ft (1m) when empty and requires sufficient thickness to prevent breakage, tearing or splitting upon collection
 - One small solid-coloured privacy bag no larger than 22 x 24 inches may be placed in each clear bag
- Maximum of six (6) paper bags of leaf and yard waste in addition to the organics cart year round
 - **Windsor residents please note, we have discontinued the leaf and yard waste special collection, running from April to November**
- Bulky items - certain large items, such as furniture, may weigh up to 75kg (165lbs). Items weighing more than 75kg will not be collected

Are You Hosting an Event in 2025?

A Special Event Permit may be required if hosting a large event in West Hants, on private or public property. Likewise, a parade, procession or a walkathon, on a WHRM Street or provincial roadway, requires a Street Event application be submitted to the Municipal Traffic Authority or to NS Department of Public Works.

REBATE

2025-26 ASSISTANCE REBATE PROGRAMS

Forms Now Available!

- **APPLICATION DEADLINE: JULY 31, 2025**
- Property Tax Assistance Rebate
- Utility Assistance Rebates (sewer, bulk water purchases)

If household taxable income does not exceed \$46,414 for 2024, property owners, sewer customers and bulk water purchasers may be eligible for a rebate (additional qualifiers apply). Applicants must reapply every year.

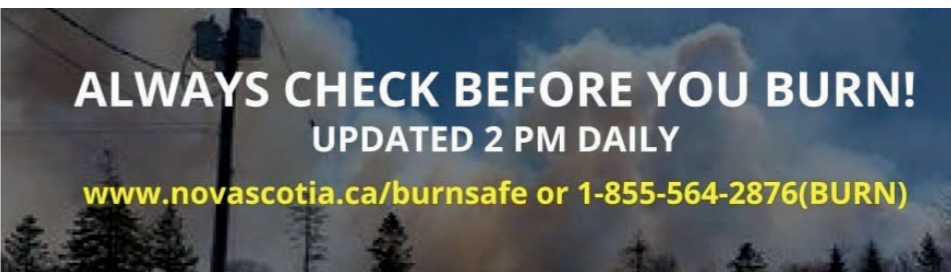
