There were 6 members of the public in attendance.

Warden Zebian advised that this was a public hearing is being held under Section 168 of the Municipal Government Act for the proposed First Amendment to the Police Advisory Board By-law, P-002. He went on to say that the public hearing gives the public opportunity to ask questions and raise concerns about the By-law noting once concluded, the Council meeting will resume and Councillors may ask questions and make comments before being called to approve or reject the proposed First Amendment to the Police Advisory Board By-law P-002.

Warden Zebian then called on the Municipal Clerk to speak on the By-law.

The Clerk informed the Police Advisory Board By-law P-001 was approved by Council on September 13, 2016 and required approval by the Department of Municipal Affairs and the Department of Justice. She stated the review by the Provincial Departments identified sections of the By-law which were not meeting requirements under the Police Act and Police Act Regulations. The First Amendment to the Police Advisory By-law corrects the errors to bring the Police Advisory Board By-law in-line with the Police Act and Police Act Regulations.

The Clerk noted the First Amendment to the Police Advisory Board By-law was short and identifies the text amendments to be made. She went on to review the details of the By-law as found in the report presented for First Reading to Council.

The Clerk stated if Council approves the First Amendment to the Police Advisory Board By-law, it would then go back to the Departments of Municipal Affairs and Justice for approval. Once the original by-law and the amendment by-law were approved by the Provincial Departments, notice of approval would be advertised in the local paper and the consolidated Police Advisory Board By-law would be in effect.

Warden Zebian asked if there any questions from the public. There were none.

Warden Zebian called for any oral or written submissions in favour of the amendment. There were none.

Warden Zebian called for any oral or written submissions in against the amendment. There were none.

Warden Zebian asked if the Municipal Clerk had any closing comments. She had no closing comments.

Warden Zebian declared the Public Hearing adjourned at 7:09 p.m.
